MSA Conflict of Interest Policy

Because many committee members for the Mythopoeic Scholarship Awards are active scholars themselves, we have formalized a conflict-of-interest policy for voting. If a committee member is the author, editor, or a named contributor to a book, they may neither nominate that book to the MSA long list (Inklings or Myth & Fantasy Studies), nor – if someone else nominates the book — can they vote in the long-list category to which the book has been nominated. If the book makes the short list, then the committee member remains ineligible for voting in that category. If the book isn't selected for the short list, they may vote freely in both categories. If the Awards Administrator is themself the author or main editor of a book that has been nominated to either list, long or short, then another committee member must verify the tally of all votes cast in that category; this policy need not apply if the Awards Administrator is merely a named contributor to a book.

MFA Conflict of Interest Policy

Because some committee members for the Mythopoeic Fantasy Awards are active in publishing, we have formalized a conflict-of-interest policy for voting. If a committee member is the author, the editor, or a publishing employee who has worked directly on a book, they may neither nominate that book to the MFA long list (Adult, YA, or Children's), nor – if someone else nominates the book – can they vote in the long-list category to which the book has been nominated. If the book makes the short list, then the committee member remains ineligible for voting in that category. If the book isn't selected for the short list, they may vote freely in both categories. If the Award Administrator is themself the author, the editor, or a publishing employee of a book that has been nominated to either list, long or short, then another committee member must verify the tally of all votes cast in that category.
